

WELCOME BACK

STEP 1: WRITING YOUR OWN STORY

- Why are you writing your story? What's the meaning behind it?
- What are the characters' flaws and how do they overcome it?
- Is there a story graph? What does it look like?
- Don't be long winded. Get to the point. Move the story forward.





STEP 2: CONVERTING YOUR STORY INTO SCENE SUMMARIES

- Divide your story into scenes based on changing locations
- What's on stage when the curtains open? What happens on stage? How does the scene end?
- Do not overly depend on the Narrator. Try to bring out information through the props, dialogue and background.
- Are there any props? Where are they?
- Keep in mind your cast should be between 10 15 characters max (including minor ones). Three to five major characters.

STEP 3: CONVERTING YOUR SCENE SUMMARIES INTO SCRIPT

- The dialogue should be real, and the characters should have a <u>distinct flavor</u>.
- Try not to write large chunks of dialogue. Remember: Your friends will be memorizing the lines. Instead of writing one whole paragraph of text, ask yourself if you can break it up.
- Following the format requirements, each page should be 1 minute long. Try to keep your script between 15 – 25 pages long.
- PLEASE DELEGATE THE SCENES TO DIFFERENT PEOPLE.
